Dear Miss Monkhouse,

I have your letter of the 2nd inst. enclosing the Account for fees in respect of Miss Pamela Williamson, and I quite understand that the fees have been a little increased, and I will get a cheque to pay the Account tomorrow when I shall be meeting some members of our Committee.

I am arranging to pay the balance of our Scholarship money in three equal instalments to the Florence Nightingale International Memorial Committee, in the same way that I used to pay those instalments to the Joint Committee of the Red Cross Societies.

Dame Alicia Lloyd-Still tells me that this arrangement is not very convenient either to your College or to the International Committee, and they would like us to pay down the £250 all in one sum, but we cannot do that, as by doing so, we should exceed our income which comes in to our Banking account in the form of dividends. Dame Alicia has asked me to have an interview with Miss Baggalay about it, who already knows how we propose to pay the Scholarship money, and I do not anticipate that I shall be able to make any change, nor do I see from an accountancy point of view why our practice should
