Later, I may be called up  
with a Territorial Unit  
which, although not one  
of the first to mobilise,  
will most likely do so  
within the next few months.

It seems unlikely  
that the College of Nursing  
will continue its educational  
activities, or that it will  
require my services in the  
immediate future.

hopes and plans for the

International Courses next year is a bitter disappointment, which I know you will share. I would like to tell you how much the richer I feel for my association with Bedford College and its staff; and I can say unhesitatingly, that last year was quite the happiest of my professional life -
