Catherine Frances Russell (Irish Free State)

RESOLVED that Miss Russell (Irish Free State) be accepted for admission for the session 1936-37.

Lulu Kathryn Wolf (U.S.A.)

RESOLVED that Miss Wolf be accepted for the 1936-37 courses and that further particulars with regard to her courses in Columbia be asked for;

that the Secretary of the American Committee of the Florence Nightingale International Foundation be informed that a course would be arranged to suit Miss Wolf's needs, but it was hoped that she would be able to fit in with the revised curriculum; if however she required a special course, would she kindly notify the College before she arrived in October.
