SCHOLARSHIPS FOR NURSES

RED CROSS SOCIETY GRANT

Two announcements affecting nurses were made yesterday.

The British Red Cross Society is to provide a scholarship of £250 to assist in the establishment of the International Florence Nightingale Foundation. Three similar scholarships are to be financed by the National Council of Nurses of Great Britain.

The purpose of the Foundation is to establish an endowment fund to put on a permanent basis the international post-graduate courses for nurses, which have been carried out in Bedford College, in conjunction with the College of Nursing.

A special committee of King Edward's Hospital Fund, appointed by the Prince of Wales, has suggested that the King's Fund should set aside each year a sum for grants to District Nursing Associations or to the Central Council, on the basis of the work done by the district nurses for all the hospital cases taken together, taking into account the amount saved to each hospital by the work done for its cases by the district nurses.
