Arrangements have this year been made for some of the students to attend courses at the Institute of Medical Psychology, and there is no reason why there should not be from time to time other special arrangements of similar nature. It must, however, be made clear that deviations from the established course will alter the financial basis of the scheme; and that this established normal course, consisting of lectures specially prepared and separately delivered to meet the needs of Florence Nightingale students, involves considerable extra demands upon the time and energies of the staff; and can only be maintained if the majority of the Florence Nightingale students follow it, deviations such as those mentioned above being limited to a few students of exceptional ~~needs~~ requirements or experience.
