



Dear Mr. Hartog,

I am anxious to bring before the Academic Council the desirability of the institution by the Senate of a University examination under the new Board of Education regulations for the training of Health Visitors. (Statutory Rules and Orders 1919 No.1293) The Board has now recognised three centres connected with the University for the purposes of this training (The King's College Home Science Department and Ratan Tata; the South Western Polytechnic; and Bedford College. For the first year's examination it is proposed to act separately and each institution is arranging its own examination. But in my view a University examination would be desirable as a permanent arrangement and would be more in accordance with the usual procedure of the University. I realise that this question may belong rather to the Extension Board than the Academic Council. I should nevertheless like to bring it before the latter in the first instance at any rate.
