At the last meeting of the Joint Consultative Committee of Institutions training Health Visitors, I was asked to bring the following suggestion, with regard to the oral part of the Health Visitors Examination, before the Bedford College Council:
" that in the examination room there should be four tables at each of which two examiners would sit, to examine in:

At Table A. Elementary physiology and the structure of the body. Personal and domestic hygiene. Food and nutrition.

At Table B. Waternity, infant and child welfare
At Table C. Infectious and communicable diseases School Medical Service.

At Table D. Sanitary Law and govermment. Elementary economics and social problems.
