Dear Miss Monkhouse,

At the last meeting of the Joint Consultative Committee of Institutions training Health Visitors, I was asked to bring the following suggestion, with regard to the oral part of the Health Visitors Examination, before the Bedford College Council:

" that in the examination room there should be four tables at each of which two examiners would sit, to examine in:

- At Table A. Elementary physiology and the structure of the body. Personal and domestic hygiene. Food and nutrition.
- At Table B. Maternity, infant and child welfare
- At Table C. Infectious and communicable diseases School Medical Service.
- At Table D. Sanitary Law and government. Elementary economics and social problems.
