Dear Miss Monkhouse,

I am enclosing a copy of the letter which I sent to the Principal on December 14th.

In the fourth paragraph I mentioned that the sum of twelve hundred pounds placed at the disposal of Bedford College for three years came to an end in 1930. You called my attention to the fact that this came to an end in July 1929; since my return I have verified this.

I am not in a position at the moment to say that this grant can be continued next year, but I feel sure if the recommendation from your Committee is placed before the League to that effect that there will be no difficulty.

I am very glad to know that the whole question of the future of the Courses after 1930 will come up for consideration during the next six months. We feel that our only hope of reducing the expenditure will be if there is an even closer collaboration between Bedford College and the College of Nursing, when English nurses can make use of some of the facilities afforded to our foreign nurses, so that the cost can therefore be divided, and will not fall so heavily upon the League.

When embarking upon this experiment some years ago, it was always with that in view, and I hope that this will some day be realised.

I am so grateful to you for the kind interest which you have taken in it all. It is a great comfort to us here to know how completely you understand the whole

situation, and I know the Secretary General will be very much guided by any recommendation which may come from your committee.
