Dear Miss Monkhouse,

Your letter of October 17th, referring to the One Year Course in Social Work at Bedford College for International Students, was received at the last meeting of my Council; together with the syllabus of the Course, which you were good enough to enclose.

I am asked to tell you that my Council will very gladly co-operate with Bedford College by giving training in Almoners' work to suitable International Students. They are prepared to recognise this Course as a substitute for the Social Science Certificate in the case of Students from countries where a training for social work is not provided. There is, however, one paragraph in the introductory notes to the syllabus to which I am asked to draw your attention. My Council wish to state emphatically that they can in no circumstances accept Students from a country "where a full training for social work is provided", and they would be glad if this could be made clear in your printed syllabus.

We understand that these Students will appear before the Council's Selection Committee in the usual way, and we note with satisfaction that they will be ready to give at least six months to the special study of Almoners' work. It will not, of course, be possible to give them the Certificate of this Institute at the end of that period, but each Student will be given a statement specifying the experience she has had.
