Dear Miss Monkhouse,

Thank you very much for your letter of May 6th. enclosing a copy of the minutes of the last meeting. I was glad to learn that the matter has been so satisfactorily settled with regard to Miss Zukowska and that she will be able to complete the course.

With regard to Mrs. Belmont, we are hoping to have a definite reply before long. In the event of her not being able to speak it is proposed to substitute a representative of the League Secretariat in her place. It is very kind of the Committee to suggest that I replace her. I think, however, as Miss Méchelynck will be also speaking, and somewhat from the point of view as I would have taken, that another member of the League Secretariat will be desirable. I will write to you again with reference to this question when we have a definite reply from Mrs. Belmont.

With reference to the date of the next meeting, I note that it is fixed for June 19th. I wonder if it would not be possible to have it a little nearer the date of the Presentation of Certificates, otherwise it will be necessary for me to spend nearly a fortnight in London, which will be difficult just at that time. On the other hand I do not wish to miss this meeting and I realize the difficulty for you on account of the Queen's visit on the 24th. June.

With reference to Lady Galway, I understood that Sir Arthur Stanley had invited her to present the certificates and also to speak. I have written to him asking him to confirm this. I think, however, that it would be just as well if you were to ring up Sir Arthur Stanley yourself in order to let him know that we are hoping that


