Recommendations for revision of the Prospectus of the
International Courses for the Session 1936-37, from
the Education Committee of the Florence Nightingale
International Foundation.

- I. There should not be three distinct Courses. The alternative suggested being a Prospectus covering the subject matter and lectures available to students.
- II. Subjects already offered in the present Curriculum should be set forth in the Prospectus as available to students under given conditions as to selection of subjects, under the direction of the Director of Social Studies.
- III. In addition to the existing subjects as set forth in the Curriculum, there should be a course in applied Psychology suitable to students who satisfy the Head of the Department that they have already had the requisite instruction in general Psychology.
- IV. Another optional course under the same conditions as above which should be offered is an introductory year's course in Ethical Principles and Practical Problems.
- V. The subjects available might be arranged in two Groups A & B Group A dealing with those subjects of an academic nature, Group B dealing with the applied and professional subjects.
- VI. A paragraph should appear in the Curriculum indicating the conditions under which special students may apply for admission to other lecture courses given in the University of London.
