Taking into consideration
the wide scope of the
Examination and the
fact that Students
are required to show
an acquaintance with
the usual subsidiary
sciences I am of
opinion that the
results are highly
creditable.

In several instances I
was struck with the

Examination of the Candidates
to add irrelevant
matter and to
answer questions that
have never been asked.
It has occurred to us
that this would be
avoided if occasional
test papers were
given during the
course & the corrected
answers returned to

Familiarity with
the candidates. The
art of answering an
Examination paper would
not only prove useful
for the public examinations
but would stand in
good stead when
reports have to be
made to Committees
or other bodies under
whom the diplomat
may have to work.
