Out of a group of fourteen students nine are taking the Hospital Administration Course this year. These represent the countries of:-

Austria, Bulgaria, Finland, Germany, Iceland, Italy, Latvia, Poland and Siam.

These students arrived in England early in August and took up their residence for two sessions of three weeks in certain Hospitals in London.

The following Hospitals were kind enough to receive the students:-

Very satisfactory accounts have been received from the Matrons of these Hospitals on the work and observations of the students, and the students themselves have written reports of their experiences.

The students are now attending the College of Nursing for a course of 20 lectures on Training School Administration given by Miss Musson, C.B.E., Chairman of the General Nursing Council, and 12 Lectures in Hospital Administration given by Mr R.P. Orde, Director of the Central Bureau of Hospital Information.

A series of coaching classes have been arranged in connection with the above on alternate Tuesdays and Fridays and for this purpose students have been divided into three groups in order to provide individual instruction.

Visits of observation to illustrate the lectures on Training School and Hospital Administration are being arranged during the winter session.
