

Recommendations for the revision of the Prospectus of the International Courses 1936-37 from Dr. Mess, Head of the Department of Social Studies at Bedford College.

- I. Three distinct "Courses" shall not be offered. There shall be instead a list in the Prospectus of the lecture subjects available to students.
- II. These subjects shall be grouped into A, B and C subjects as follows:-

Group A.

1. Public Health Nursing
2. Family Case Work
3. Principles of Hospital & Training School Administration.

Group B.

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| 1. Personal Hygiene & Preventive Medicine | 35 hrs. |
| 2. Social Conditions & Social Administration | 30 hrs. |
| 3. Elementary Psychology | 30 hrs. |
| 4. Advanced Psychology | 30 hrs. |
| 5. Ethical Principles and Practical Problems | 30 hrs. ? |
| 6. Physiology | 45 hrs. |

Group C.

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| 1. A Comparative Study of Modern Industrial Problems | 20 hrs. |
| 2. Principles of Education and Methods of Teaching | 14 hrs. |
| 3. History of Nursing | 10 hrs. |
| 4. Eugenics | 10 hrs. |
| 5. Tuberculosis | 6 hrs. |
| 6. Nutrition | 8 hrs. |
| 7. Public Health Administration | 8 hrs. |
| 8. Maternity & Child Welfare | 10 hrs. |
| 9. Psychiatry | 6 hrs. |

- III. Every student will be required to take at least four courses; of these one and one only must be selected from Group A; and one at least from Group B.

Unless special permission is given students will not be allowed to undertake more than six courses.

- IV. The selection of subjects shall be made in consultation with the Director of Studies. The final decision shall rest with the Organisation Committee of Bedford College for Women.
- V. In the case of students with exceptional academic or other qualifications special courses of study may be arranged, but only if application has been made and particulars have been supplied before coming to England.
