Dear Miss Monkhouse,

I do apologise for having overlooked your letter of the 2nd November and the consequent long delay in answering it. When stating in my letter of October 22nd that my Council could not accept students from countries "where a full training for Social Work is provided", I was quoting the term used in your own report which you have been good enough to forward: "students from countries where a full training for Social Work is provided will only be admitted in exceptional circumstances". We took this to refer to a course that would be recognised by the authorities in the student's own country as a suitable preparation for Social Work. In such cases we should require the student to qualify for general Social Work at home before we could consider taking her to train under this Institute for Hospital Social Work.

Is I think I have already said to you in previous correspondence, my Council interpret "International students" as meaning in this case non-English speaking students.
