In reply to your letters of October 11th I am directed to send you the following resolutions which were passed by the Council at their meeting on Thursday last:

a. Increased representation of the F.N.I.F. on the Organisation Committee.

That the representation of the F.N.I.F. on the Organisation Committee be increased from 2 to 3 members.

b. Application for status of "Associate Students of the University" for the International Students.

That application be made to the University of London that the status of "Associate Students of the University" be granted to the International Students.
