LEAGUE OF RED CROSS SOCIETIES

REPORT OF PRACTICAL WORK

done by

INTERNATIONAL PUBLIC HEALTH STUDENTS.

2nd TERM, 1928/29.

During the Christmas term eleven Thursdays were given to practical work. The thirteen Public Health Students had this work arranged for them in Lambeth in the various schools, Infant Welfare Centres and in the Special Departments of St. Thomas's Hospital.

The majority of students observed only one type of work throughout the term and were so able to obtain a good understanding of it. Miss Rousarova has made a particularly complete study of Tuberculosis work and has seen practically all the work that is being done in Lambeth, including the work of the social agencies whose case papers she has been able to study.

Miss Hamblin was able to enter into the work being done at the Springfield Welfare Centre and has done a considerable amount of work for them, gaining experience herself.

Five students have been working with the London County Council School Nurses and have seen all that these nurses do in the schools and clinics. In every case the School Nurses have been most helpful and have occasionally arranged to take students to the Juvenile Courts and to special treatment centres.

Four students have worked in the Tuberculosis Department at St. Thomas's Hospital where they are able to be present at the doctor's consultation - visit with me and study the case papers.

Two students have been in the Mothercraft Department of St. Thomas's Hospital where they are able to attend Dr. Jewesbury's teaching clinic. Two students have been in the Venereal Disease Department and the Sister here very kindly arranged for six "Internationals" who have been in the Department to attend a short course of nurses' lectures on the subject.

Dr. Thompson, M.O.H. Lambeth, very kindly arranged for four students to do some observation visits with his Health Visitors and Women Sanitary Inspectors. The students found these extremely helpful.

During the Christmas vacation we tried to arrange that the students saw work in which they had particular reason to be interested. The Austrians each studied one type of social work for young people, Skilled Employment Committee, Preventive and Rescue Work and Infant Life Protection. We were very pleased to be able to send three students to see the work now being done by two "Old International Students" Miss Brinton and Miss Whitehead. Miss Shenton in Surrey also took the Latvian nurse and showed her Health Visiting in Haslemere.

I have attached a detailed Time-Table of the work done by each student.

I should like permission from the Committee to spend a few days in Birmingham, East Sussex and in Hertfordshire, in order to find out what opportunities are afforded there for the International Students.
