Dear Miss Jebb,

The Committee of Management of the Foundation have, as you know, always been extremely appreciative of the generous co-operation given by Bedford College in the conduct of the International Courses.

The changes in administration have necessitated a period of re-adjustment and review and we are very grateful for the understanding way in which the College authorities have given their co-operation throughout the period. We are particularly grateful to you for your help and advice on the various Committees of the Foundation, and thank you for your close interest.

It is, therefore, with particular pleasure that I am writing to tell you of the resolution passed at the Third Ordinary Meeting of the Grand Council of the Foundation held in London last July. The resolution reads as follows:-

"The Grand Council of the Florence Nightingale International Foundation notes with satisfaction the continued co-operation of Bedford College for Women in the educational work of the Foundation; approves the continuation of this co-operation for a period of five

years, 1937-1942 and authorises the Committee of Management if and when required, to appoint representatives from among their number to serve on the Committee for the Organisation of International Courses at Bedford College."

We have received various recommendations from the Grand Council which will necessitate our request for certain small adjustments in the present scheme, but these adjustments I propose should be taken up later with the Council of Bedford College when they have been carefully examined by our Committee of Management.

In the meantime, may I say how extremely pleased I am at the prospect of our continued co-operation in this work.
