

REPORT OF PRACTICAL WORK OF PUBLIC HEALTH STUDENTS  
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August - October 1930  
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The three English Students are taking the Health Visitors' Course this year. Two of them started their practical work on August 5th, and have done nine weeks' work. Miss Merry was not able to start until August 18th and has only done seven weeks. Miss Merry and Miss Parker have been with the C.O.S. all the time. They have been very interested in the work they did there, and have done some careful written work for me.

Miss Crothers, who is a more experienced worker, has seen something of the work of the St. Thomas's Mothercraft, Tuberculosis, and Women's Out Patients Departments, and has done four weeks' work in one of the Birmingham Infant Welfare Centres. She wishes to prepare herself for administrative work, probably in the Queen's Institute for District Nursing, and I am hoping to arrange for her to have four weeks in the East Sussex County later in her year. She has found it difficult to express herself on paper and her written reports have not done her justice. I have good reports of her interest and her capability from the places where she has worked.

Miss Fussenegger and Miss Thomas have both done seven weeks of observation work. They have done five days visiting each with a District Nurse and five days with a Health Visitor. They have had two weeks each in the St. Thomas's Babies Hostel, and two weeks in the Tuberculosis Department visiting with me and studying the case papers. They have both been interested in what they have seen, and have written careful reports for me.

Miss Fussenegger is observant, and is obviously thinking over everything she sees. She has had a good deal of experience of visiting in her own country and knows her work well. I have given more time to coaching these two students than I have done with others in the past, and during their first two weeks I met them in the afternoons after they had been out visiting, and we discussed what they had seen. I think this has helped me very much to know their special difficulties, and I hope it has helped them to correct some of their misunderstandings at once.
