Note by the Secretary in connection with telephone  
conversation with Miss Baggallay.

Spoke to Miss Baggallay over the telephone about the subject of this letter (7th March 1938) and explained that in both requests she was asking for special privileges for the International Students which were not allowed to ordinary Bedford College students; she explained that to have to pay 10/6 registration fee and 16/- Union fee was more than the students could afford.

I pointed out that the 10/6 had been incurred at the special request of the F.N.I.F. on the understanding that such a fee would have to be paid by the students themselves. I also pointed out that if she was convinced that the Union membership was of little value to the International Students she might put forward a request for exemption for the group. She is, however, unwilling to do this because she says many of the students would very much like to be members of the Union and get great advantage from it, if they did not have to pay the 16/- fee.

Miss Baggallay asked me to put off bringing this letter to the Finance Committee for the present, saying that she would think the matter over and probably put forward her request in another form, namely asking for a reduction in the composition fee at present paid by the International Students.
