Madam,

In confirmation on my telegram of May 19th and in answer to your letter of the 16th May, I now write on behalf of the Council of Bedford College to inform you of the following resolutions which were passed at their meeting on Wednesday, 18th May :-


- (i) that during the session 1921-22 an International Public Health Nursing Course will be given at Bedford College for women, University of London, as requested by the League of Red Cross Societies
- (ii) that if the final examination is passed at the end of the session some form of certificate will be given showing that the student has studied for one year and successfully passed the examination at Bedford College.
- (iii) that the sessional fee for the above course be fixed at 45 guineas per student.

I have further to add that the above resolutions are subject to the League being prepared to guarantee a minimum of 10 students. Bedford College on their side do not undertake to accept more than 15 students, though the Council will be prepared to consider applications for more than this number.
