Dear Miss Monkhouse,

Thank you very much for your two letters of November 5th, and for the expression of thanks from the Committee for the Organization of the International Courses.

1. re Students to be withdrawn from the Course

I note that the Council wishes Miss Naidu and Miss Kintaka to be withdrawn from Bedford College on account of their being insufficiently qualified to continue the course. The League will make special arrangements for these two students to continue their studies in England.

2. re Students allowed a further probationary period

I notice that Miss Inouye, Miss Rotterowna, Miss Marti and Miss Noble are to be allowed to continue their studies until Christmas, and it will depend on Mrs. Reid's report as to whether they will be permitted to continue the course.

3. re Prospectus for the International Courses 1929/30

These alterations have been made in the prospectus, which is now in the hands of the printers; copies will be forwarded to you as soon as it is ready.

4. re League of Red Cross Certificate

The alterations in the certificate, which were approved at the last meeting, have now been made, and a copy of each certificate were forwarded to you for your files. The League will be very pleased to accept your recommendation that this certificate be only given on the recommendation of the committee for the Organization of the International Courses to such students as satisfactorily complete either of the courses.


5. re Presentation of Certificates 1929
