I hope that this letter will reach you in time in order to let you know how sorry I am that I am unable to be at the meeting of the Committee for the Organization of the International Courses which will be held to-morrow. I have just returned to Paris and am unable to leave again immediately.

You will be interested to know that the Board of Governors, at their meeting last week in Brussels, considered the continuance of the International Courses necessary and provision has been made in the Budget for them until 1932. I shall probably be in London next week and I hope to meet the Principal and have a talk with her about the future.

It was a great pleasure to meet several of the Old Internationals at the 14th Conference in Brussels. They had been for the first time nominated as delegates by their Red Cross Societies; it was both interesting and most encouraging to hear of the work which they are doing in their respective countries.
