Course Outline:

The objective of the course is to convey to graduating nursing students an understanding of the relationship between nursing's managerial and nursing's clinical involvement at the levels of both Staff Nurse's and Sister's responsibilities.

Though issues to be explored shall be some of those likely to be met with in actual everyday practice, they will be considered from the point of view of theoretical as well as empirical terms to help to both widen and to deepen students' perspectives to pose alternate choices, the bases on which they are predicated and to reflect on factors likely to impinge and to effect decision-making in matters of nursing.

The theoretical perspectives of the course will draw on organisational, social-psychological and sociological theory and build on students' own previous work in areas of social policy, economy, nursing studies and sociology drawing together the individual strands of nursing studies' previous three years' work. Two main components of the course will focus around the following issues:

- a) Principles and practices of nursing management
- b) Consideration of potential application of nursing research at clinical level.
