Dear Miss Monkhouse,

Would you be so kind as to put in the Agenda of the Meeting on May 4th, the admission of Students for the Courses 1928/29?

We have received up to date twenty-three applications for the two courses. Of these, seven of the application forms are complete, and we propose to bring these before the committee for consideration. We hesitate to recommend the admission of two of these applicants on account of their age: Miss Mullin (Canadian) being 53 and Miss Marti (Spanish) 44 years of age. As the question of age, especially in the Latin countries, is rather a delicate one, it is always difficult for us to refuse Students on these grounds, when once they have applied, and it will help us very much if an age limit for admission could be stated in the syllabus. I should be glad if this question could be brought up again for discussion at the committee meeting. I will send over next week, the list of applications and copies of the application forms.

The prospect for next year's courses looks very promising, and up to the present the standard seems quite good. It is satisfactory to find a larger number of Red Cross Societies giving full scholarships, the best demonstration that we can have of their appreciation.

I am hoping to be at the meeting on May 4th, and will not forget this time to call upon you before the meeting.
