Dear Mrs Carter,

I had already realised that we should take an early opportunity of considering the question of carrying on the scheme for the International Red Cross group of students, so I am very glad to have your letter and know something of what you have in mind.

Until the question has been carefully looked into, I do not find it possible to say whether we shall be able to entertain the idea of carrying on the scheme without subsidy. It is certain that we could not do so without considerably raising the fees.

We shall have first to find out whether the College of Nursing are willing to co-operate for a longer period. It is important to have an assurance of this as, if there is a chance of the scheme as a whole collapsing on other grounds, it is hardly worth while to go fully into the further question.

We shall be able to talk over the matter fully when you are in London in January. I thought I would put before you the ideas that in the first instance suggested themselves to me.
