Talking About Careers...

Welfare Work

A CAREER which is gradually offering more scope to the girl with nursing ability is that of nurse in a large business or industrial establishment.

Recently the demand for nurses in factories and business houses has increased, and the work offers scope and interest outside that offered by the usual branches of the nursing profession.

Law

ARRANGEMENTS for First Aid are now required by law in factories and in workshops, and the provision of first aid is an important part of welfare work.

This provides an opening for the qualified nurse who may be in charge of an ambulance room for the treatment of accidents or who may co-operate with welfare supervisors or doctors in looking after the health of the workers.

Wide Scope of the Work

THE scope of the industrial nurse's work, however, is wide.

She must, in addition to treating illness and injury at work, take the part of an experienced clerk by keeping records; she must exercise her powers of discernment and sympathy, she must concentrate on the psychological aspect of her work, gaining the confidence of the workers, keeping a careful eye on those who are in the convalescent stage after an accident or illness, helping them with general health queries, or putting the needy in touch with organisations for their relief.

In short, the industrial nurse must be a sympathetic but practical ministering angel, in step with her comrades in other branches of the nursing profession.

Courses of Training

THE COLLEGE OF NURSING, in co-operation with Bedford College for Women (University of London), with a



view to satisfying the increasing demand for nurses in industry, has arranged a full-time day course which covers about a year.

Three years' general nursing as a basic qualification, of course, is necessary, and midwifery experience is useful.

The new course includes the study of the health of the industrial worker, the nursing service in industry, psychology (general and applied), the principles and administration of industry, and the modern industrial system.

During the course practical experience is gained at specified centres. Fees range from thirty to forty-five guineas.

For those nurses who already work in the industrial sphere, there is a part-time course covering a period of six or seven months, the fees for which range between twelve and fifteen guineas.

APPOINTMENTS offer interesting work, and openings are likely to increase in Belfast as in cities across the water.

Salaries are similar to those paid to welfare supervisors, ranging from £150 a year non-resident.
