The Sub-Committee have held two meetings, one on January 17th and one on January 31st.

They beg to report that they are of the opinion that to give effect to the wishes expressed by the Committee of Management of the Florence Nightingale International Foundation in their letter of 11th October 1937, a full-time Tutor should be appointed in place of the two half-time Tutors as at present (Miss Baggallay and Miss Parsons), to be responsible for all the practical work of the International Students. That such a post should be held jointly from the Councils of Bedford College and of the College of Nursing, it being understood that the professional side of the work would be directed from the College of Nursing. The Committee further considered that the Tutor should be resident at International House, 15 Manchester Square. That her salary should be comparable with that at present received by the two half-time Tutors taken together.

The Committee have accordingly considered conditions of appointment for such a post and beg to recommend

Recommended that a whole time Tutor for the practical work of the International Students be appointed on the conditions as attached.

The Committee further beg to report that in connection with the appointment they considered one name, that of Miss Daisy Bridges, who had been an International student at Bedford College for the year 1936-37 and who at the close of her course had been given a Certificate with distinction in the whole course. Miss Bridges in October 1937 obtained a Rockefeller Travelling Scholarship for a study of nursing education in Canada and the United States. She has been in Toronto since October 1937 and will be travelling in the United States from March to August 1938. Previous to

taking up the International course, Miss Bridges had held the posts of Ward Sister (1925-33) and Night Sister (1933-36) at St. Thomas's Hospital, where she received her nursing training from 1919-23, gaining an Honours Certificate. She is 43 years of age.

The Committee were of the opinion that Miss Bridges was well suited by personality and experience to fill the new post of Tutor in Practical Work to the International students, and they therefore beg to recommend

Recommended that Miss Daisy Bridges be appointed Tutor to the International Students on the terms recommended in the draft conditions of appointment.
