Dear Miss Monkhouse,

Thank you very much for your letter of August 1st which I received in London, enclosing a copy of the minutes of the last meeting of the Committee for the organization of the Courses for International Students.

I note that you are fixing the date of the next meeting for November. As a rule we have had this meeting the first week in October, immediately before the beginning of the new session. This has been found necessary as some of the Students have been admitted provisionally, and in the event of them not knowing sufficient English, or for some other reason, it may seem advisable for them not to begin at Bedford at all. After six weeks of practical work with Miss Baggallay and Miss Bowes, Mrs. Reid will have some idea of the advisability of admitting them or not. We can afford to be strict with regard to admitting candidates whose English is really so weak that Mrs.Reid feels they can possibly benefit by the theoretical course. We can then make other arrangements for them. I am thinking particularly of Miss Marti - Spain - and Miss Kintaka - Japan the admission of the Ceylon student will also have to be confirmed now that her papers have been received.

I hope to have mimeographed copies of the changes to be made in the curriculum, to come up for discussion at the Miss Monkhouse, 18/8/28.
