REPORT ON INTERNATIONAL NURSE ADMINISTRATORSTUDENTS.Easter Term, 1932.

During last term the Nurse Administrator students attended lectures at the College of Nursing on Training School administration, History of Nursing and Educational Psychology and Methods of Teaching. In connection with these latter lectures, the students have given excellent practical teaching classes each week. Visits of observation to the British Home and Hospital for Incurables, Streatham and to Lewisham Hospital were arranged in connection with the lectures on Training School administration and to the Wellcome Historical Museum, the British Museum and St. John's Gate, Clerkenwell in connection with the History of Nursing lectures. During the Easter vacation, practical work was arranged for the students.
