Special Committee appointed to interest girls  
and young women in Nursing as a Career.

The Medical Officer of Health, Dr. Veitch Clark, has been asked by the Ministry of Health to take steps to stimulate the recruitment of nurses for the hospital and civil defence services in the City. Among other arrangements is the organisation of a Nursing Exhibition to be held in the Exhibition Hall of the Central Library from 4th. to 16th. May 1942.

I am instructed by Dr. Veitch Clark, to ask if you have in your possession any material which could be used to illustrate the work of the Florence Nightingale International Memorial Foundation in the training of nurses from certain European and other countries prior to the outbreak of war.

It would be a great help if we could borrow for our Exhibition charts or photographs illustrating any aspect of the training and work of these nurses from all over the world, as we feel that this would demonstrate better than anything else the Universality of nursing today.

We should, of course, take great care of any material you send, and would return it immediately after the Exhibition.
