Dear Miss Monkhouse,

Referring to your letter of June 24th, which arrived during my absence in Canada, I am so pleased to see that the Council of Bedford College has recommended that the Course be continued until 1932. You also refer to a report on the question which we shall receive next month. I wonder if this report could cover fairly fully the last three years, during which time Bedford College has been responsible; these three years have been ones of very interesting experimentation and development. I would like to suggest that the report refer to your co-operation with St. Thomas's Hospital for providing facilities for practical training, and to the appointments of Miss Baggallay and Miss Bowes, as well as to the new courses of lectures which have been added. From our point of view the experiment of the last three years has been very satisfactory. It has not only relieved us here of a great deal of responsibility, but has brought Bedford College and the College of Nursing more closely in contact with the Students, and has, therefore, I think, resulted in a much better understanding of their needs.

We are having an important meeting here in Paris on October 24th of Red Cross nurses, followed by a meeting of the Executive Committee of the Board of Governors, when your recommendations with regard to the Courses will come up for approval. We should be glad, therefore, to have your report to circulate to the members beforehand.

I was so pleased to hear from Mrs. Reid that Bedford College had approached the School of Hygiene, and that we can count upon their close collaboration in the future. This will mean, will it not, that Dr. Jamieson, Director of the Public Health Department of the School of Hygiene

will replace Dr. Brincker on the committee?


