Dear Miss Monkhouse,

In reply to your letter of the 7th instant, the Selection Committee for the Director in the Education Department of the College was held yesterday. Mrs Reid being present.

It has been recommended by the Committee that Miss Hester Constance Parsons, trained at St Thomas's Hospital, should be appointed Director in the Education Department, and this recommendation will go before the Council on Thursday next.

I enclose herewith, the particulars of Miss Parsons' qualifications and experience. It was thought that perhaps your Committee would like to see Miss Parsons, and if this should be the case, I will make arrangements accordingly.

I am directed to inform you that pending the appointment of a Director, the Council appointed my Assistant, Miss Goodall, to carry out the duties in connection with the Nurse Administrator Students. Miss Goodall has placed all these Students in the various Hospitals during the vacation. The reports from the Matrons are now coming in and the Students will be coached on the work they have done.

Miss Goodall is also attending the Training School Administration Lectures and will coach the Students in the subject. Miss Goodall has had experience in Hospitals, both Voluntary and State, is a good linguist, and has been able to help the Students with the difficulty of language. It is suggested that Miss Goodall should give a Report of the Students work to date at the Organisation Committee, if this should be in accordance with the wishes of your Committee.
