Dear Miss Monkhouse,

With reference to the enclosed account, might I direct your attention to the letter addressed to you on the 24th September, enclosing a list of students coming from the College of Nursing and asking if they might be entered for the following Courses of Lectures:-

Mrs. Reid	Social Administration	Mon. 11 - 12,
Dr. Brincker	Visits of Observation	Mon. 2 - 5,
Dr. Brincker	Hygiene - lectures & visit	Tues. 9,
Dr. Brincker	Public Health	Wed. 9.

The College of Nursing in giving their students their timetables, have only directed them to the lectures mentioned in my letter of the 24th.

After conferring with Miss Tuke, it was agreed that it would be advisable for the Nurses taking the six months' Course of Training for Health Visitors from the College of Nursing, not to enter either for Mrs. Edkins' lectures in Physiology or for Mrs. Williams' lectures in Economics.

With regard to the Visits of Observation, if our fifteen students have attended these Visits, this would increase the charge made on the enclosed account, at 1½ guineas a term.

With reference to the number of students attending, Miss Charlton was unable to come from Newcastle to ^{take} the Course, and Miss V. Davies had to withdraw at the end of a month. We understand, of course, that Miss Davies would be included in the account, but Miss Charlton never having come to London for the Course, might perhaps allow a re-adjustment in the number of students. I understand that I did notify you that Miss Charlton was unable to take the Course, but if it was an omission on my part, I would offer you an apology.
