Dear Miss Monkhouse,

I am leaving for Rome on Saturday, and will be away from the office until October 7th. I hope to get over to London on October 10th for the committee meeting on the 11th.

Miss Smith is busy preparing the copies of the curriculum. She will have sufficient made for all the members of the committee, and I will bring them over with me when I come.

I have received a letter from Mr. Bonham Carter of the Nightingale Fund asking that Miss Hester Viney join the International Group as a Public Health student. I have sent the application forms to her asking that she get the endorsement of the British Red Cross, and forward them to Miss Dorsey as soon as possible. Miss Dorsey will send you a copy in order that her application may be brought before the committee on October 11th. She will also send you copies of the application forms of Miss Naidu, India and Miss Wambeek, Ceylon. These two students were admitted provisionally, their application forms not having been received.

I gather that Mrs. Reid will be prepared to talk to the committee on one or two doubtful students whose knowledge of the language is so slight that it may not be possible for them to continue the course.

All the twenty-five students have arrived, and Miss Dorsey's report of them sounds fairly encouraging on the whole. She says that they are a very vigorous


