Report of Interview with Miss Hallows, 27.1.31.

Interviewed Miss Hallows concerning the time of the lectures in Hospital Nursing, fixed in the College of Nursing syllabus for 6 p.m.. The time was inconvenient for the International Students.

Miss Hallows pointed out that the time of the lectures had not been fixed without consultation with Bedford College, where the notice had been sent in July 1930. I agreed that this notice had been duly sent but that its significance had escaped the notice of Mrs. Reid until the students actually came to attend the lectures.

Miss Hallows stated that there was no difficulty this year in changing the time of the course from 6 p.m. on Thursday to 9.30 a.m. on Friday morning, because there were no outside students coming to the course, and it was unlikely that any would now come because 3 lectures had already been given. If however in the future the course was still wanted at 9.30 a.m. it would have to be given as a special course for Bedford College students, as outside students, who would be diploma students, could never come in the mornings.

She asked how early in the year Bedford College would like to be informed of the College of Nursing syllabus and she was told not later than 1st May.
