The course of Principles of Education for International Students now consists of 12 lectures and practice classes, the fee has therefore been reduced from 2 guineas to £1: 11: 6.

It was considered advisable by the Advisory Committee to increase the number of lectures in the course of Hospital Administration. For the session 1930-31 it has been decided to give 12 or possibly more lectures if need arises. The fee is therefore raised from £1: 6: 6 to £1: 11: 6.

Demonstrations of the National School of Cookery are arranged for our Health Visitor Students and Mrs Reid and Miss Baggallay felt that it might be desirable to arrange for any British students taking the years course at Bedford College to attend these demonstrations with our students.

These fees are, of course, subject to one seventh reduction in the case of Bedford College Students.

I am also sending a list of the dates of the first lectures in the course for the next session.
