Miss Prida, Mexico ) St. Thomas's Hosp. Sept. 4 - 25.

For the last week Miss Prida had joined Miss Peza in going to St. Bartholomew's Hospital each day and Miss Thomson had attended at the Redhill Hospital, Edgware, a municipal hospital under the Middlesex County Council, where she could study any differences between the administration of voluntary and municipal hospitals.
