Dear Sir,

I have delayed answering your letter of November 7th, asking for the usual affiliation fee of two guineas hitherto paid by Bedford College to the Joint Consultative Council, as the question of our continuation of this course of training has been under consideration. My Council have now reluctantly decided that the College course of training for Health Visitors, which has been in abeyance since the outbreak of war, should not be resumed. I think, therefore, that it will be no longer appropriate for Bedford College to be affiliated to the Joint Consultative Council.

Dear Miss McEwen,

The College Council has recently had under consideration the future of our course of training for Health Visitors. We have reluctantly decided that it should not be resumed. The pressure on space in our Social Studies Department is very great indeed. The number of Health Visitors taking our course was never large and we do not feel that under present conditions we could make arrangements for a few students.

I have written to Mr. Calder to say that in the circumstances we should not wish to continue to be represented on the Standing Conference of Health Visitor Training Centres.
