COURSE UNITS IN NURSING

Thank you for your letter of 18 June enclosing an advance copy of the proposal for course S290 "Chemitherapeutics and Pathophysiology". Professor Oppe telephoned me today and asked that, before I circulate the proposal to members of the BAC (as agreed at the meeting on 14 May), I should seek from you information relating to the proposed teaching arrangements for this course.
